

According to SCOPUS, 118 papers in English have been published in 2017, or scheduled to be published in 2018.

The Journal on which is published most of the papers is Journal of Cleaner Production (35); the most prolific author is Sergio Ulgiati (11) and the country of origin of the highest number of papers is China (66).

It is great and unique opportunity for discussing together: we will have to wait two years to do it again.

(The following information is taken from: cep.ees.ufl.edu/emergy/conferences/ERC10 2018/ index.shtml) "The meeting will be organized into two-and-a-half days of presentations (Thursday, Friday and Saturday, January 25-27, 2018). There will also be two concurrent pre-meeting workshops on Wednesday, January 24th from 1:00-4:00pm: Prosperous Way Down workshop at Phelps Lab, and SCALEM® Users' Workshop at the Marston Science Library. Papers on theory, methodology, and applications of emergy are welcome. As always, we will allow selforganization to prevail. Participants are encouraged to contact colleagues and friends to develop a "set of papers" that somehow reinforce each other around a particular theme. Should this occur, send us an email suggesting the subject of the theme and titles of the papers. In case there are no self-organized themes, we will organize papers into sessions in November.

Participants are encouraged to present a 20 minute paper on new developments related to theory, methods and/or applications of emergy synthesis. We will also have a special poster session for those wishing to present topics which



may foster more detailed discussion. As always, we will try to avoid parallel sessions and so we may not have enough time for all papers and therefore may be selective for oral presentations. Contributions not selected as oral presentations will certainly be included in the poster session.

The proceedings will be published. Each participant should bring a 10-page manuscript of their oral presentation to the conference (electronic copy please, see author guidelines). Papers will be peer-reviewed and comments returned to authors for final revisions. There will be a deadline strictly enforced for submission of papers (3 months from the conference)."
